

Mr. L. French having proposed his notice of Motion, that a Commissioner should be sent to Normandy to enquire into the Winter Dairying &c and stated his reasons for pressing the subject on the Committee.

Mr. L. A. Heamish read several extracts from the Report of the Royal Dublin Society regarding the opinions of the Judges of Butter at their Shows, and suggested that the Government should be asked to send a Commissioner to Normandy and other Countries to enquire into the system of Butter making and Winter Dairying.

The question having been very fully discussed by the various members of the Committee it was finally arranged that Mr. French should suspend his Resolution for the present, and it was Proposed by Mr. W. R. Meade Seconded by Colonel Pouldham and carried

"That Mr. French, Mr. L. A. Heamish & Mr. W. R. Sullivan be appointed a Sub-Committee to press on the Government the advisability of procuring information on the manufacture of butter, as produced in other Countries, and on the subject of Winter Dairying."

Mr. R. Warton was invited to read a paper on Winter Dairying at a future Meeting.

On the Motion of Mr. Warton, Seconded by Mr. Gallway it was "Decided to give a Subscription of £1-1-0 to the Irish Pure Butter Trade Association."
