The minutes of the last meeting were read & confirmed

Read letter from Mr Anderson with reference to the Margarine traffic stating that a Co-operative Union was being formed & asking for the society to join same it was decided to send a subscription of £1- and the secretary - was directed to write to Mr Flavin & enquire what was being done with reference to the Margarine Act

Read letter from Secretary General Post office pointing out that the cost of bringing the telegraph wire to Show Yard would be about £8 if the society were willing to bear this the would erect the battery and supply an operator it was decided to guarantee the cost

On the motion of Mr L A Beamish seconded by Col Sheldham it was decided to have the Show Yard connected with the Telephone office secretary to make the best terms he could with the Company

The letting of the Show Yard was under consideration when on the motion of Mr L A Beamish sec<sup>d</sup> by Sir G Colthurst the following prices were decided on for the whole Show Yard including buildings £20 per day for the jumping ground & stand £15 per day for the football ground £5 per day

The recommendation of the Show Committee as to the suspending all free tickets except the press was laid before the Committee when on the motion of Sir G Colthurst sec<sup>d</sup> by L A Beamish the following resolution was unanimously passed. "That in accordance with the terms on which a sum of over £1000 was contributed by the citizens of Cork towards the erection of the new Show Yard, the free list of tickets be entirely suspended with the exception of the press
