ADVISABILITY OF HOLDING THE SUMMER SHOW.

The President stated that the next business before the Meeting was to consider the advisability of holding the Society's Summer Show during the present year. The Show Committee had considered the matter, but they decided to refer same to this Meeting for the general views of the members, and figures prepared by the Secretary showed an estimated loss of £102 if the Show was held. The Secretary then stated that the estimate was based on gate receipts of £210, against £1,058 for the last Show they held. Their chief revenue, outside, gates, was from Trade Stands, amounting to over £1,000 annually, and, in preparing his estimate for the proposed Show, he did not anticipate they could have any trade stands. Several Members having expressed their views on the matter, and after discussing same, it was unanimously agreed, on the motion of Mr. N. Hayes, seconded by Mr. A. Mullins, not to hold the Summer Show.
