Reference to Minutes of Show Committee representative of Society on Consultative Council:

The President referred to the Minutes of the Show Committee where he had been elected to again represent the Society on the Consultative Council. Mr. E. Wall then proposed that the action of the Show Committee be confirmed, and that the President, Mr. E.J. Clarke, be the Society's representative on the Consultative Council. This was seconded by Mr. Ml. Twomey.

The President stated that, in connection with the recent Summer Show, the gate receipts amounted to £3,300, and he would like to tender the Society's best thanks to the general public, the stewards, the Garda, the Railway authorities, the Press, the exhibitors, and to all others who helped to make the Show such a success.

Suggestions for future Shows:

In connection with suggestions for future Shows of the Society:—

- (1) that the public Address system should announce in the halls the hours the Jumping Competitions commence, also when they would be in progress;
- (2) that attendants be put in charge of the covered stand, to prevent persons from standing in front of people in the seats on this Stand;
- (3) the condition of the road through flooding (near Sheep Shed).
- (4) condition of Gent's Lavatory near No. 3 Ring;
- (5) that the horses entered for the various Jumping competitions should wear different coloured numbers, to indicate the particular Jumping competition taking place;
- (6) that a Grooms' & Herds' Dining Room be provided, and that meals be served from early morning, if possible.
- (7) that a Yard Vet. be appointed, who would have a supply of First-Aid equipment for animals;
