He (the President) expressed his gratitude to all who contributed to the smooth running of the Show, and particularly to the Stewards for their excellent work.

Recommendation

The recommendation of the Show Committee that the Annual Summer Show & Industrial Exhibition be held on 29th & 30th June, 1949 was ratified.

Suggestions with  
regard to late Summer  
Show:

In connection with the recent Summer Show, several members drew attention to discrepancies in the Show. Mr. F. Murphy said that the Judges had complained re the inadequate space for judging of sheep. He (Mr. Murphy) also stated that a number of persons in the Shikling Enclosure could not see the Parade, as the animals were not paraded far enough to the eastern side of the Ground. Mr. Young complained about the loading of the cattle at the Cattle Bank, and suggested that someone should be in attendance to expedite the loading and getting away of the lorries.

Mr. J. F. D. Good complained about the In-and-Out Gate Jump at the recent Show. Mr. A. Mullins suggested that someone should be in attendance on behalf of the Society at the Stand in the Jumping Enclosure, to ensure that persons would move more closely in the seats, as a larger number could be accommodated if this practice was carried out.

He (Mr. Mullins) also suggested that a charge should be made for the Stand.

These queries will be considered by the Show Committee in due course.
