The Minutes of the last Meeting were read and signed.

A letter was read from the President (Mr. E.J. Clarke) thanking the Committee for their vote of congratulation for his winning the Championship for Aberdeen-Angus at the recent Show & Sale of Bulls at Ball's Bridge.

A letter was also read from the Secretary, Cork Co. Council, enclosing a copy of the regulations made by the Co. Council under the Co. Crk (Control of Dogs) Order of 1929, which included -

- (1) No dog during any of the hours between sunset and sunrise shall be or be allowed to be outside the bounds of the lands or premises by the owner of such dog unless such dog shall be under the control and in the company of its owner or of some person authorised by such owner to accompany and control such dog, the owner of such dog, and the person, if any, for the time being in charge thereof, and any person causing, directing or permitting such dog to be outside the lands or premises occupied by the owner of such dog, shall each in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1945.
- (2) If a dog during any of the hours between sunset and sunrise is allowed outside the bounds of the lands or premises occupied by the owner of such dog, and such dog is not under the control and in the company of its owner, or of some person authorised by such owner to accompany and control such dog, the owner of such dog, and the person, if any, for the time being in charge thereof, and any person causing, directing or permitting such dog to be outside the lands or premises occupied by the owner of such dog, shall each in respect of his own acts or defaults be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1945.
- (3) Any dog in respect of which an offence shall be committed against these regulations may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by Section 3 of the Dogs Act, 1906.
