

Chairman's statement  
re No. of entries  
received for Show & Sale  
of Bulls; also details  
of arrangements:

Suggestions for Summer  
Show:

Mr. N. Hayes stated that there was a total of 218 Bulls entered for the forthcoming Show & Sale of Bulls against 190 for 1949. He (Mr. Hayes) then gave details of the various arrangements, and programme, for this Show, and informed the members present that the Show Committee would be considering the List of Prizes for the Annual Summer Show at a Meeting to be held on Thursday, March 2, and he invited the members of the Committee (if they had any suggestions to make) to put them forward now, so that they may be placed before the Show Committee.

Mr. T.N. Desmond, B.L. suggested that, in connection with the class for Gelding or Mare likely to make a Hack or Polo Pony, there should be two classes for this type of animal) - (a) for 15.1 to 15.3 hands. (b) for 14.2 to 15.1 hands. This was supported by Mr. C. MacDonald.

Mr. Desmond further suggested that we should endeavour to have added attractions in the Jumping Enclosure, in addition to Jumping competitions.

Mr. J.B. Casey suggested that we should have a Dressage competition.

Mr. J. F. De Good said that there should be a Time Jumping Competition.

The Secretary stated that the Committee were not unmindful that added attractions were very necessary in the Jumping Enclosure, but, like most Show Committees, they found it difficult to get attractions that would appeal to the general public. However, this matter would come before the Show Committee in due course.

Mr. J.F.D. Good suggested a class for "Hereford Bull or Heifer Calves, calved on or after Sept. 1, 1949, and he also suggested that the prize money in all the Hereford classes should be increased.

Mr. F. Murphy suggested that we should include classes for Ayrshire Cattle.

Mr. Chas. MacDonald suggested that we should have classes for Trade Turn-Outs (Light and Heavy Van Horses, and Draught Horses).

A suggestion was also made that we should have a Parade of Cattle on the first day, and horses on the second day.

Mr. Ml. Twomey said he would like to thank all those who had voted for him at the recent election of members to the General Committee. Mr. T.N. Desmond said he would like to endorse the remarks made by Mr. Twomey.
