Letter from Prof. Boyle:

The following letter was read from Professor C.Boyle:-
" University College, Cork.
12. 1. 1950.

Dear Mr. Byrne,
I observe a notice of motion by Mr. MacDonalld for the next Meeting of the Munster Agricultural Society to the effect that the Professor of Agriculture at U.C.C. shall be made an Honorary Vice-President of the Munster Agricultural Society. I understand that Mr. MacDonalld is under the impression that the Professor of Agriculture has to be elected to the General Committee each year and in order to overcome this difficulty he proposes that I be elected an Honorary Vice-President. He is not apparently aware that the Society honoured the position I occupy by making the holder of the Chair of Agriculture in U.C.C. a member of the General Committee without having to be elected annually. I am very grateful to Mr. MacDonalld for his thoughtful action but as the object he has in view has already been secured I do not propose putting the Society to the trouble of altering the rules in this respect.
