Mr. T.N. Desmond, B.L., said it had been represented to him that we should have a second Jumping Competition for Children's ponies at the Show. This was referred to the Show Committee.

Permission given to pay prize money after Show:

Barter, the Secretary was given permission to pay the prize money, as recommended by the Finance Committee, with reference to the forthcoming Summer Show, before the next Meeting of this Committee, the details of these prizes to be available for the next Meeting.

Letter from C.A.O. Co. Cork Comm. of Agric. in connection with tickets for Show:

A letter was read from Mr. P.J. McDermott, Chief Agricultural Officer, Co. Cork Committee of Agriculture, asking for 50 passes for the staff of the County Committee of Agriculture. In reply to a question, the Secretary stated that no detailed list had been submitted by the C.A.O. as to whom these tickets would be issued. After a discussion, it was agreed to issue the tickets, but, that in future, a detailed list of names should be received with the application.

Re admission tickets for members of Macra na Feirme:

A similar request was received for 50 tickets from the Secretary, Macra na Feirme, Athy, Co. Kildare, which tickets would be required for stewards and Judges, in connection with the competitions, confined to members of the above, to take place on Thursday, the 3rd day of the forthcoming Show. It was agreed that the tickets be issued, but that they would be available only for Thursday, June 26.

Judges:

Approval was given to invitations being sent to Mrs. de Vere Hunt to Judge Ladies' Hunters; Mrs. Hope Johnstone to act as Judge of Children's Ponies, and Mr. E. Glen Browne for Jumping Competitions, at the forthcoming Summer Show.

Suggestion re having a 2nd jumping Competition for Children:

The Secretary stated that Mr. T.N. Desmond, B.L., had suggested at the last Meeting of the General Committee that there should be a second Jumping competition for children's ponies at the forthcoming Show. After discussing the matter, the Committee felt that it was entirely too late to organise such a competition, and the matter would be borne in mind for the 1953 Summer Show.
