Read letters from Mr Dempster of Oswestry Shropshire stating that he would bring over two dogs to compete for the Collie trials provided he was allowed £3 for his expenses same as Royal Dublin Society gave him, after some discussion the Committee decided that as there were some local entries it would not be fair to pay towards them to pay the expenses of Welsh dogs coming over, but that they would give Mr Dempster £5 to come over & judge the trials amongst the local dogs, and to bring 3 dogs which were to do the penning but not to compete for the prizes

Mr L. A. Beamish announced that Mr. Indell was unable to act as judge but that he had kindly offered to nominate a substitute it was accordingly decided to ask Mr. Indell to recommend a ^{Gentleman} ~~man~~ who would act as judge for Horses Shropshire Sheep and Shorthorned Cattle, and also to ask Mr. Bonifant to act as judge for sheep

The Secretary announced that the ^{Burke} ~~Local~~ Market Trustees had nominated Messrs. J. Forrest & C. Murphy to act as judges for their prizes

Mr. J. Donovan proposed that there be horse jumping on both days of the show and that the inside yard be cleared at a certain hour each day and a charge of 4/- made to defray expenses, there being no seconder to the proposition the matter after some discussion dropped
