

Meeting of Show Committee held
Friday April 7th at Show Ground.

Mr J. L. Head presides also present Maji O'Connor,
L. O. Beams, W. Roberts, Jas Byrne, J. O'Sullivan,
J. Dwyer, A. J. Warren.

Mr John O'Connor Carrigrohane objected to the award
of first prize to exhibit no 105 in class 23, dairy cow the
property of Mr Jeremiah Murphy Little Island, on the ground
that the cow was not milked on the evening before the
Show in the presence of the stewards as required by rules.

Mr Morrison steward stated that he informed Mr
Murphy on Wednesday afternoon that the cow should be
milked in his presence at 6 p.m. and Mr Murphy
replied he saw no reason for having her milked.
Mr Morrison further stated that he went ^{at 6 p.m.} to the stall
which he found locked, and having procured a key he
saw the cow and calf in the stall; the calf was muzzled.
The cow was not milked in his presence.

Mr D. Ross another steward of the class
repeated the facts mentioned by Mr Morrison.

Mr Murphy attended and admitted that Mr Morrison
told him that the cow should be milked at 6 p.m. He
denied that the calf was muzzled and stated he got
the cow milked.

Mr John O'Connor stated he saw the cow and calf
in the stall and that the calf was muzzled.

The Show was then unanimously decided to
uphold Mr O'Connor's objection.

Mr J. O'Sullivan objected to # 20 111 obtaining
first prize in class 28 on the ground of being over age.
The owner Mr John Stanley having admitted that the
exhibit was over the age Mr O'Sullivan's objection was
upheld.
