Read letter from Royal Agricultural Society of Ireland stating that as that Society was now amalgamated with the Royal Dublin Society they could not in future subscribe to the funds of Local Societies

Mr James Hartland read ^{II} a most interesting paper on Forestry and planting of waste land in Ireland showing specimens of the insects that were most destructive to our firs
