A letter was read from Lord Hawkebury State Steward & Chamberlain

A letter was read from Mr Cecil A. P. Osborne waiving all claims  
to Mr Lohie's special for Bull dogs & the Secretary was directed to  
convey to Mr Osborne the Committee's thanks for his courteous & considerate  
action

A letter was read from Mr J. Lynch asking that his red setter be awarded  
3<sup>rd</sup> prize in open class - no third prize in this class having been given
