

The Objections lodged by Mr. G. S. Holdster, with respect to Mr. Wallis's Thorough-bred Mare "Prescription" viz - "That the horse was not in the Stud Book, and also that not being developed as a Stallion should be, he claimed the first prize for his horse Zanzibar."

The objections having been carefully considered, it was decided,

that the Secretary should communicate with Mr. Holdster, and inform him that the Committee were satisfied that the horse was entered in the Stud Book, and that from enquiries made and information received they believed the horse was fully qualified to act as a Mare. The deposit fee lodged with objection paper to be refunded as the Committee did not consider the objections were made in a captious spirit.
